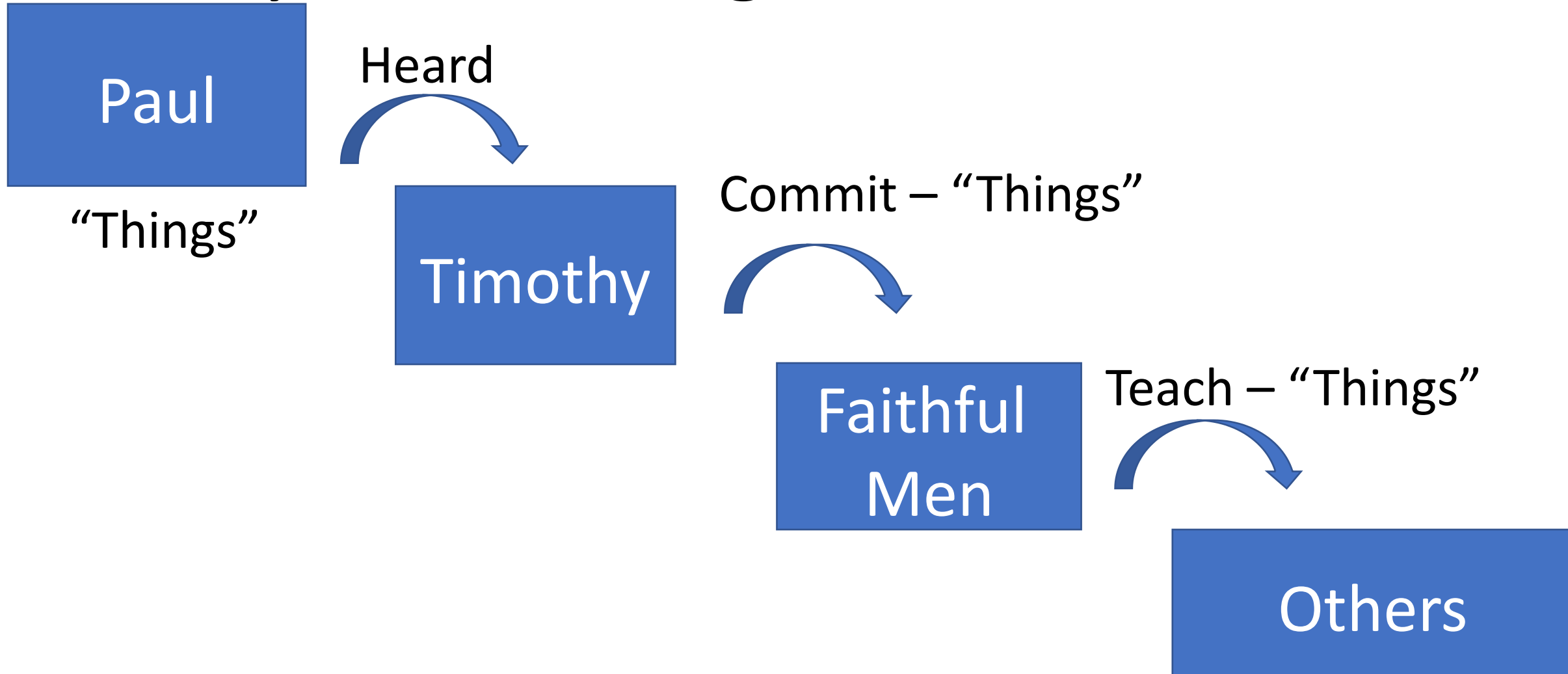

Consider the source: careful who you listen to

The Right Source: “Things Heard from Paul”

“Among many witnesses” - Not secretly; “martus”: martyr; includes everything Paul taught as he and Timothy traveled to different regions and assemblies of believers

Paul wrote I and II Timothy during his second imprisonment in Rome, just before his martyrdom

My Gospel: Ro. 2:16, 16:25; 2 Timothy 2:7-8

The preaching of Jesus Christ according to the revelation of the Mystery

Consider the source: careful who you listen to

The Right Source: “Things Heard from Paul”

Don't listen to Paul and you will be building with the wrong materials, on a foundation not laid up for us

1 Corinthians 3:9-10 – WHO and HOW

The Foundation: PAUL's – Ro.16:25-26 The preaching of Jesus Christ according to the revelation of the mystery

NOT: The preaching of Jesus Christ according to the revelation of prophecy

That's the point of 2 Timothy 2:2

Consider the source: careful who you listen to

The Right Source: “Things Heard from Paul”

The work of building (lit. edification) must strictly follow the instructions given by Paul – the HOW

1 Corinthians 3:10-11 – According to the grace given to Paul (2 Timothy 2:15)

Paul is the architect, the general contractor – master builder (1 Timothy 1:15-16 – “pattern”)

Two distinctly different types of materials, that will determine what is of value and lasts forever – 1 Co 3:12-15

Consider the source: careful who you listen to

The Right Source: “Things Heard from Paul”

The Corinthians were building with wood, hay and stubble

Consider the revelation of a new wisdom – I Co 2:1-13

Consider the four categories of spiritual development

I Co 2:14 – The natural man (spiritually dead)

I Co 2:15 – The spiritual man (governed by the Spirit, spiritually mature) – Galatians 6:1; I Co 3:1

I Co 3:1 – Spiritual infants (naturally immature)

I Co 3:1-4 – The carnal man (willingly immature)

The Right Source: “Things Heard from Paul”

Terms of spiritual immaturity/instability

Tossed to and fro – Eph. 4:11-14

Works of the flesh – Eph. 5:15-21

Corinthian problems: contentions, divisions, sin-tolerance, in-fightings, focusing on infant behavior (spiritual gifts)

I Co. 1:1-9 Their standing

Consider the source: careful who you listen to

The Right Source: “Things Heard from Paul”

Corinthian evidences of carnality

Contentions: 1:11-17

Envyings, strife, divisions – I Co. 3:1-4

Sin-tolerance – I Co. 5:1-7

In-fightings – I Co. 6:1-8

Insensitivity and self-centered – I Co. 8:1-13

Focusing on infant behavior – emphasis on spiritual gifts

I Co. 12-14
